SAMPLE BEQUEST LANGUAGE

A gift to The Junior League of Washington in your will or revocable trust proclaims your confidence that we will continue to serve our mission of engaging artists and audiences in an evolving exploration of creativity.

A bequest:

- is easy to arrange,
- will not alter your current lifestyle in any way, and
- can be easily modified to address your changing needs.

Residual Bequest Language

A residual bequest comes to us after your estate expenses and specific bequests are paid:

I give and devise to The Junior League of the City of Washington (Tax ID: 53-0213317) all (or state a percentage) of the rest, residue, and remainder of my estate, both real and personal, to be used for its general support (or for the support of a specific fund or program).

Specific Bequest Language

Naming The Junior League of Washington as a beneficiary of a specific amount from your estate is easy:

I hereby give the residue (or _____ percent of the residue) of my estate to The Junior League of the City of Washington (Tax ID: 53-0213317), to further the objectives and purposes of the Fund (or specify a program).

Contingent Bequest Language

The Junior League of Washington can be named as a contingent beneficiary in your will or personal trust if one or more of your specific bequests cannot be fulfilled:
